2013 Ohio Junior Classical League Convention

738 students from 27 Ohio schools attended the state competition, Friday March 8 - 10. 139 teachers, adults, and college students were also in attendance. Summit sent a delegation of 40 students to compete.

This is the 5th consecutive State Championship for Summit Latin! Summit had a total of 1,447 points, Shaker Heights (Cleveland area) had 1,113, and Madeira had 989.

Kim and I are always amazed at what our students accomplish. And one of the reasons we participate in the OJCL is that there is an avenue to success for all sorts of different talents. Some achieve in academics, others hold positions of leadership; some create wonderful works of art, others perform and display their skills on stage. 2013 Medusa Mythology Exam

The Medusa Mythology Exam is a 50 question multiple-choice test given every April to over 10,000 high school students from across the United States. This exam is much more challenging than the National Mythology Exam and requires a thorough knowledge of Greek mythology.

The theme of this year's competition was 'War on Trojan Soil,' and questions focused on the ten year war at Troy: from the famous Golden Apple to the face that launched 1,000 ships to Achilles' heel to the trick of the Wooden Horse.

Over two-thirds of Summit students earned an award this year.

2013 Exploratory Latin Exam

The Exploratory Latin Exam is now in its 9th year. Its purpose is to promote enthusiasm for the classical world in elementary and middle schools. Over 1,600 Latin students from 26 states participated in the exam this year. It is a 50 question multiple choice exam on the Latin language, derivatives, Roman life, mythology, architecture, etc. This year's exam included 10 'special topic' questions on 'Classical Geography.'

It is tough to earn the top award just 1 time; it is quite an achievement to get the Gold Medal numerous times. Congrātulātiōnēs!


2013 NJCL Latin Honor Society Induction
