


# 2016 Classical Literacy Exam

The Classical Literacy Exam is given to Latin students in May. This competition measures basic knowledge of all aspects of Greek and Roman civilizations, including vocabulary, expressions, mythology, history, culture, quotes, and geography.

- 6th grade: 100+ terms (titanic, verbatim, labyrinth, etc)
- Level 1: 300+ terms (persona non grata, the Fates, Nike, etc)
- Level 2: 450+ terms (Hellenistic, pseudo, phalanx, etc)
- Level 3: 600+ terms (the Vulgate, Catiline, kudos, etc)

The test consists of 60 fill in the blank questions:

- > 45 or more correct answers earn a Corona Aenea (bronze crown) ribbon.
- > 50 or more earn a Corona Argentea (silver crown) ribbon.
- > 55 or more earn a Corona Aurea (gold crown) ribbon.
- Chocolate bars are included with the awards!

Archimedes was a Greek mathematician and inventor who lived in Sicily in the 3<sup>rd</sup> century BC. He is credited with inventing the water screw (a means to raise water from one level to another) and several complex war machines (which were used against the Romans when they laid siege to Syracuse in 212 BC). He once boasted, 'Give me a place to stand and I will move the earth!' He realized the means of determining the density of materials and exclaimed, 'Eureka!', a Greek word which means 'I have found it!'

## 2015 NJCL Convention

13 Summit Latin students, 1 alumnus, and 1 teacher attended the National Junior Classical League Convention in late July at Trinity University in San Antonio TX. The NJCL, the national organization which promotes the study of Latin in secondary schools, has over 48,000 members and is one of the largest youth organizations in the country. 1,600 students, teachers, college students, and chaperones attended the 62<sup>nd</sup> annual convention this summer. The convention is filled with a variety of competitions and activities: academic tests, art contests, live performances, a talent show, a toga parade, and much more. Summit Latin students have been attending this event for the past 17 years.

#### Leadership

1 student was elected to state office in the Ohio JCL in March and performed important duties at convention. 12<sup>th</sup> grader Dustin Argo, the OJCL Secretary, helped to organize & lead the 70 Ohio delegates during the week. He presided over daily meetings of the Ohio delegation and recorded the minutes. This is the 17<sup>th</sup> consecutive year that a Summit student has been an officer for the state Latin organization. In addition, Summit Latin teacher Larry Dean has served as the OH Certamen Coach for 17 years and the OH State Chair of Students for 7 years. #### Art

#### Certamer

The Latin word certamen means 'competition' and is the name of a Jeopardy!-style game in which all the questions are about the Latin language and classical civilization. Summit had students on all 3 levels of Ohio Certamen teams: 9<sup>th</sup> grader Julia Dean was the captain of the 11<sup>th</sup> place Novice team; Caroline Klette and Michael Warden were on the 8<sup>th</sup> place Intermediate team; and recent graduate Jesse Campbell and 11<sup>th</sup> grader

Tullus Dean were on the 2<sup>nd</sup> place Advanced team. The Advanced team won its Semi-Final round and earned the honor of playing on the big stage against FL (the champion) and CA (3<sup>rd</sup> place).

#### **Scholarships**

Jesse Campbell was honored with 2 big awards. First, he won the 'Dennis Bartlow' Travel Award, which covered the \$1000 for his registration fee and travel costs to convention. Second, he also was the winner of the \$2000 'Anne Covington' National Latin Honor Society Scholarship. These prestigious awards recognize Jesse's knowledge of Latin and dedication to the JCL.



# 2016 National Mythology Exam

This was the 27th year of the National Mythology Exam. It was taken in February by over 10,000 students in the United States, Canada, and Australia. The goal of the exam is to promote the study of classical mythology and literature in secondary schools. It has 50 multiple choice questions. This year's exam had 3 sections:

- the main classical gods & goddesses Zeus, Athena, Mars, etc
- Book 4 of Vergil's Aeneid the tragedy of Dido, queen of Carthage
- Jason & the Argonauts the Golden Fleece and the witch Medea

The theme of this year's competition was 'Hercules: The 1st Avenger,' and questions focused his adventures outside of his 12 Labors.



The National Junior Classical League sponsors 3 online exams: Roman Civilization, Classical Etymology, and Latin Vocabulary. This is the 5th year of these challenging contests.

Almost 4,000 students took the online **Roman Civilization Exam**. It was a 50 question, multiple choice exam: 25 questions on history, and 25 questions on civilization.

Over 5,500 students took the online **Classical Etymology Exam**. It was also a 50 question, multiple choice exam. Its purpose is to test a student's ability to handle both Latin and Greek derivatives and their usage in the English language. 39% of Summit students earned awards.

# 2016 Exploratory Latin Exam

The Exploratory Latin Exam is now in its 12th year. Its purpose is to promote enthusiasm for the classical world in elementary and middle schools. Over 1,400 Latin students from 25 states and Australia participated in the exam this year. It is a 50 question multiple choice exam on the Latin language, derivatives, Roman life, mythology, architecture, etc. This year's exam included 10 'special topic' questions on 'Famous Roman Women.'
