

2017 Medusa Mythology Exam

The Medusa Mythology Exam is a 40 question multiple-choice test given every April to over 10,000 high school students from across the United States. This exam is much more challenging than the National Mythology Exam and requires a thorough knowledge of Greek mythology.

The theme of this year's competition was 'Rise and Fall of the Titans,' and questions focused on the generation of the gods who ruled the universe prior to Zeus and the Olympians. Famous Titans include: Cronus who castrated his father and swallowed down his infant children; Atlas who held up the sky from the earth and gives his name to the Atlas Mountains and the Atlantic Ocean; and Prometheus who stole fire for mankind and was punished by having an eagle peck out his liver each day.

The National Junior Classical League sponsors 3 online exams: Roman Civilization, Classical Etymology, and Latin Vocabulary. This is the 8th year of these challenging contests.

1. Over 1,800 students took the online **Roman Civilization Exam**. It was a 50 question, multiple choice exam: 25 questions on history, and 25 questions on civilization. Over 30% of Summit students earned an award.

2. Over 5,000 students took the online Classical Etymology Exam. It was also a 50 question, multiple choice exam. Its purpose is to test a student's ability to handle both Latin and Greek derivatives and their usage in the English language. Over 27% of Summit students earned awards.



Over 149,000 students from all 50 states and 16 foreign countries participated in the 41st annual National Latin Exam. The NLE consists of 40 multiple choice questions on grammar, vocabulary, derivatives, mythology, history, and culture. This exam is a chance for students to test their knowledge against Latin students throughout the world. 7th-12th grade Latin students take this exam.
