2018 Classical Literacy Exam

The Classical Literacy Exam is given to Latin students in May. This competition measures basic knowledge of all aspects of Greek and Roman civilizations, including vocabulary, expressions, mythology, history, culture, quotes, and geography.

- 6th grade: 100+ terms (e.g., A.D., herculean, and valedictorian)
- Level 1: 300+ terms (e.g., ignoramus, Marc Antony, and plebeian)
- Level 2: 450+ terms (e.g., habeas corpus, quorum, triumvirate, and marathon)
- Level 3: 600+ terms (e.g., amicus curiae, St. Jerome, and preterition)

The test consists of 60 fill in the blank questions:

- > 45 or more correct answers earn a Corona Aenea (bronze crown) ribbon.
- > 50 or more earn a Corona Argentea (silver crown) ribbon.
- > 55 or more earn a Corona Aurea (gold crown) ribbon.
- Perfect exams win a special gold 'Perfecta' medal.
- > Chocolate bars are included with the awards!

One of his pupils & close friends was the philosopher Plato, who immortalized his teacher by making him the main character in his philosophical dialogues. Socrates believed that self-examination was crucial.

2017 NJCL Convention

Twelve Summit Latin students attended the National Junior Classical League convention at Troy University (AL) from July 25 to July 29. Over 1,600 students, teachers, college students, and chaperones from 40 states participated in the 64th annual gathering hosted by the NJCL, the national organization which promotes the study of Latin in secondary schools. The NJCL has over 1,200 chapters and over 48,000 students. The convention is filled with a variety of competitions and activities including academic tests, art contests, live performances, a talent show, a toga parade, and more.

Three students were elected to state office at the Ohio JCL Convention in February and performed important duties at the summer convention. This is the 19th consecutive year that Summit students have been elected to positions of leadership at the state level. Julia Dean is the OJCL Parliamentarian, Caroline Klette is the OJCL 1st Vice-President and Historian, and Joseph Delamerced is the OJCL President. Through these positions of leadership, Julia, Caroline, and Joseph helped to organize & direct the 65 Ohio delegates during the week-long competition. They also presided over daily meetings of the Ohio delegation.

In her capacity as Parliamentarian, Julia ran the voting caucus as the group debated which national candidates would receive Ohio's votes. As Historian, Caroline submitted a digital scrapbook documenting the OJCL's 2017 activities and earned 4th place for her efforts. President Joseph Delamerced presided over all the daily meetings of the OH delegation. He ran the meetings with efficiency, humor, and grace.

Tullus Dean was one of the 11 winners of NJCL Scholarships. Tullus receive the \$6,000 Red and Rhea Miller Scholarship for his dedication and service to the JCL. He plans to double major in Classics and Business at Xavier University.

Joseph Delamerced and Jimmy Fraley were honored at the convention for Perfect Scores on the National Latin Exam in March. These two were among the 1,112 students out of 135,000 who earned a Perfect Score. It is quite an achievement to be member of such an exclusive group!

Joseph had an outstanding convention. He placed 9th Overall in Graphic Arts points. He earned 1st in Individual Service to the Community - he puts in countless hours tutoring students in classical mythology and participating in other service events. In addition, Joseph won 1st in State Website - he made the site (www.ojcl.org) more user friendly and incorporated a variety of social media. Joseph embodies the 5 Pillar of Summit and 'aims high' in all his pursuits!

Summit Latin teacher Larry Dean is presently in his 8th year as OJCL State Chair of Students and in his 18th year as the OJCL Certamen Coach. "The students never cease to amaze me. The officers provided outstanding leadership and served as role models for the OH delegates. The certamen players devote weeks of the summer to their studies. And, of course, everyone finds new friendships with students from Summit, Ohio, and across the nation."

Also at the convention was Summit Latin teacher Lisa Mays (alumna 2005). "It's fun to see the students apply their Latin knowledge across a variety of competitions – certamen, academics, sports. It was really great that so many of our students were recognized nationally for their hard work and dedication. My favorite part happened at the last fellowship: students were already telling me about their plans for next year's convention. Hopefully, even more of them will take on leadership roles since the 2018 convention is at Miami University and we will be the host state."



2018 National Mythology Exam

This was the 29th year of the National Mythology Exam. It was taken in February by over 10,000 students from over 400 schools in the United States, Canada, and Australia. The goal of the exam is to promote the study of classical mythology and literature in secondary schools. It has 50 multiple choice questions. This year's exam had 3 sections:

- the main classical gods & goddesses Zeus, Athena, Mars, etc
- Book 10 of Homer's <u>Odyssey</u> Aeolus and the bag of winds, the witch Circe and the magic plant moly, and the giant, man-eating Laestrygonians
- ancient beginnings Prometheus and the theft of fire for mankind, Pandora's box (the explanation for evil in the world), and Deucalion (the Greek Noah) and the story of the Flood



This drawing is based on a famous fresco which depicts the Laestrygonians destroying Odysseus' fleet and killing most of his men.



The Exploratory Latin Exam is now in its 14th year. Its purpose is to promote enthusiasm for the classical world in elementary and middle schools. The ELE is a 50 question multiple choice exam on derivatives, Roman life, mythology, art & architecture, etc. This year's exam included 10 'special topic' questions on 'The Seven Wonders of the Ancient World.'

Questions included:

- > If your teacher said, 'ambula ad ianuam!', what should you do? (walk to the door)
- > Aures audiunt. ____ plaudunt. (manus)
- > Which of the Wonders were used as tombs? (the Great Pyramid & the Mausoleum)

2017-2018 Medusa Mythology Exam

The Medusa Mythology Exam is a 40 question multiple-choice test given every November to over 10,000 high school students from across the United States. This exam is much more challenging than the National Mythology Exam and requires a thorough knowledge of Greek mythology.

The theme of this year's competition was 'Mythological Women: Magnificent and Maleficent.' Famous women include: the witch Circe, who transformed Scylla into a dog-headed monster and changed Odysseus' men into pigs; Pasiphae, who gave birth to the bull-headed Minotaur; and the Sirens, whose beautiful singing lured sailors to their death.

28% of Summit students earned an award this year.




