2019 Classical Literacy Exam

The Classical Literacy Exam is given to Latin students in May. This competition measures basic knowledge of all aspects of Greek and Roman civilizations, including vocabulary, expressions, mythology, history, culture, quotes, and geography.

- 6th grade: 100+ terms (e.g., A.D., herculean, and valedictorian)
- Level 1: 300+ terms (e.g., ignoramus, Marc Antony, and plebeian)
- Level 2: 450+ terms (e.g., habeas corpus, quorum, triumvirate, and marathon)
- Level 3: 500+ terms (e.g., amicus curiae, St. Jerome, and preterition)

The test consists of 60 fill in the blank questions:

- > 45 or more correct answers earn a Corona Aenea (bronze crown) ribbon.
- > 50 or more earn a Corona Argentea (silver crown) ribbon.
- > 55 or more earn a Corona Aurea (gold crown) ribbon.
- > Perfect exams win a special gold 'Perfecta' medal.
- > Chocolate bars are included with the awards!



Cyclopean wall - 'A fortification wall made from massive stones.' The huge chunks of stone which comprise such walls are named for the Cyclops, huge mythological monsters with 1 eye in the middle of their foreheads. The picture above shows the Cyclopean walls of the Greek city-state Mycenae. The entrance is called the Lion's Gate because of the frieze above the gate with the 2 lions on either side of the pillar.

2018 NJCL CONVENTION

22 Summit Latin students, 2 teachers, and 1 recent Summit graduate attended the 2018 National Junior Classical League (NJCL) Convention at Miami University from July 23-28. The NJCL is a youth organization which promotes the study of Latin in secondary schools. There are 40,009 NJCL members in 993 schools throughout the country. 51 schools are 'Century Clubs' which have over 100 members, and Summit is part of this select group with 116 members. The summer convention is a week-long 'academic village' with over 1,400 students, teachers, and adult chaperones. It has a variety of activities, including tests, performance arts, graphic arts, colloquia, spirit contests, sports, and social activities.




There are a number of leadership opportunities available for NJCL members, and Summit has had teachers and students in positions of leadership for 20 consecutive years.

- ➤ Julia Dean has been on the Ohio JCL Executive Board for 2 years and is presently serving as its 2nd Vice-President.
- > Ryan Burns is the OJCL Regional Coordinator of Service Activities
- ➤ Tullus Dean (2017 alumnus and Xavier University student) is the Secretary of the Ohio Senior Classical League, the college organization which assists the NJCL at its conventions.
- Latin teacher Larry Dean has served for 19 years as the OJCL Certamen Coach. Certamen is a Jeopardy!-style academic competition with questions about the Latin language and classical civilization. All 3 levels of OH certamen teams advanced to the Semi-Finals this year.
- Lisa serves as a mentor to all the student members of the Executive Board and oversees all the activities of the OJCL.

Here are some of the highlights of the convention:

- Irene Calderon, Jimmy Fraley, and Kendall Richard were members of the OH Novice Certamen team which finished 8th in the nation. Jimmy was the captain and led the team in questions answered. All 3 won spots on the team during a tryout process in June.
- 4 Summit students were recognized at the General Assembly on Thursday for their performance on the National Latin Exam. Irene Calderon and Nicholas Stanis earned Perfect Papers, an accomplishment achieved by less than 1% of students. Julia Dean and Brandon Harris were honored for their continued excellence on the NLE, with 4 consecutive Gold Medals.
- Latin teacher Larry Dean was given the Silver Bowl Award for his long-time service to the NJCL. This was Larry's 20th convention, and his children Tullus and Julia gave eloquent speeches to the General Assembly to honor this achievement (https://www.instagram.com/p/BlvyXV-ByYT/?taken-by=larry81dean and https://www.instagram.com/p/BlvzJbyHYCN/?taken-by=larry81dean).
- Brigid Devine and Connie Nelson won 5th in the nation for the Summit Latin Publication *Vox Latina* (https://view.joomag.com/vox-latina/0438824001511143516?short). They were co-editors of this online magazine.
- Julia Dean and Joseph Delamerced won 2nd in the nation as webmasters of the OJCL website (www.ojcl.org).
- Ryan Burns and Patrick Casanas won 1st place for their skit for Roll Call, where each state has 30 seconds to entertain the audience as the numbers of delegates is announced.
- Joseph Delamerced won \$500 for his performance on the 3 NJCL Online Exams. Latin = \$\$\$\$.

2019 National Mythology Exam

This was the 30th year of the National Mythology Exam. It was taken in February by over 9,000 students from 400 schools in the United States, Canada, and Australia. The goal of the exam is to promote the study of classical mythology and literature in secondary schools. It has 50 (for the 6th grade) or 60 (for the other grades) multiple choice questions. This year's exam had 3 sections:

- the main classical gods & goddesses Zeus, Athena, Mars, etc
- Book 6 of Vergil's <u>Aeneid</u> Aeneas gains entrance to the Underworld with the Golden Bough and visits his father Anchises, who shows him future Roman heroes drinking from the river Lethe
- the Underworld the famous criminals punished in Tartarus, including Tantalus (ever hungry and every thirsty, the source of the English word tantalize) and Sisyphus (is forced to push a boulder up a hill but never succeeds, the source of the English word Sisyphean)



The punishment of Sisyphus in Tartarus is so famous that it is used in cartoons even today, 3,000 years later.

2019 Ohio Junior Classical League Convention

561 students (and over 100 teachers, adults, and college students) from 23 Ohio schools attended the state competition March 8-10 in Columbus. Summit sent a delegation of 41 students to compete.

Summit placed 1st in Overall Points, 2nd in Total Per Capita Pts, and 5th in Academic Per Capita Pts. We earned 1238 total pts, Shaker Heights was 2nd with 872, and Indian Hill came in 3rd with 854.

The victory was a result of a consistent effort in all areas of competition: contests submitted before convention, creative arts performed at convention, graphic arts like models and mosaics, electronic competitions like the Summit newsletter and a commercial, and academic tests like derivatives and mythology. Other activities included general assemblies, a toga banquet, a Jeopardy-style game called certamen, a talent show, elections, service projects, and more.



2019 Exploratory Latin Exam

Over 1000 students from 24 states competed in the 15th annual Exploratory Latin Exam. Its purpose is to promote enthusiasm for the classical world in elementary and middle schools. The ELE is a 50 question multiple choice exam on derivatives, Roman life, mythology, art & architecture, etc. This year's exam included 10 'special topic' questions on 'Ancient Geography.' Questions included:

- > If your teacher said, 'ambula ad ianuam!', what should you do? (walk to the door)
- > Aures audiunt. _____ plaudunt. (manus)
- > Ubi est Alexandria? (in Aegypto)



2018-2019 Medusa Mythology Exam

The Medusa Mythology Exam is a 40 question multiple-choice test given every November to over 10,000 high school students from across the United States. This exam is much more challenging than the National Mythology Exam and requires a thorough knowledge of Greek mythology.

The theme of this year's competition was 'Where have all the heroes gone?' It emphasized famous heroes, the places they visited, and what they did there. Examples include: Odysseus, his adventure in the Underworld, and his conversation with the prophet Tiresias; Aeneas, his stop in Carthage, and Dido's suicide when he departed for Italy; and Hercules, his 1st Labor at Nemea, and his killing of the Nemean Lion.

The National Junior Classical League sponsors 3 online exams: Roman Civilization, Classical Etymology, and Latin Vocabulary. This is the 9th year of these challenging contests.

Over 4,600 students took the online **Classical Etymology Exam**. It was a 50 question, multiple choice exam. Its purpose is to test a student's knowledge of both Latin and Greek derivatives and their usage in the English language. 40% of Summit students earned awards.

Over 139,000 students from all 50 states and 20 foreign countries participated in the 43rd annual National Latin Exam. The NLE consists of 40 multiple choice questions on grammar, vocabulary, derivatives, mythology, history, and culture. This exam is a chance for students to test their knowledge against Latin students throughout the world. 7th-12th grade Latin students take this exam.


