### 2020 Classical Literacy Exam

The Classical Literacy Exam is given to Latin students in May. Only the 6<sup>th</sup> grade and a few US students participated this year because of the reduced curriculum during remote learning. This competition measures basic knowledge of all aspects of Greek and Roman civilizations, including vocabulary, expressions, mythology, history, culture, quotes, and geography. The 6<sup>th</sup> grade list has over 100 terms, including quid pro quo, the face that launched 1000 ships, and narcissistic.

### 2019 NJCL CONVENTION

11 Summit Latin students, 2 teachers, and 1 Summit alumnus attended the 2019 National Junior Classical League (NJCL) Convention at North Dakota State University from July 25 to July 31. The NJCL is a youth organization which promotes the study of Latin in secondary schools. There are 33.299 NJCL members in 1,130 schools throughout the country. Some of these schools are 'Century Clubs' which have over 100 members, and Summit is part of this select group with 107 members. The summer convention is a week-long 'academic village' with over 1,400 students, teachers, adult chaperones, and college helpers. It has a variety of activities, including tests, a Jeopardy-style game called Certamen, performance arts, graphic arts, colloquia, spirit contests, sports, and social activities.



There are a number of leadership opportunities available for NJCL members, and Summit has had teachers and students in positions of leadership for 21 consecutive years.

- Ryan Burns is the OJCL President. He is the leader of the OH delegation, runs all the state meetings, and supervises all the state activities. This is the 6<sup>th</sup> time that the President has been a Summit Latin student.
- ➤ Julia Dean (2019 alumna who will be attending the University of Cincinnati) is the Parliamentarian of the Ohio Senior Classical League, the college organization which assists the NJCL at its conventions. She is in charge of elections. This is her 4<sup>th</sup> year of leadership in the JCL.
- ➤ Tullus Dean (2017 alumnus and Xavier University student) is the President of the OSCL. He oversees all the activities of the college students as they help to run the state and national conventions. This is his 5<sup>th</sup> year of leadership in the JCL.
- Latin teacher Larry Dean has served for 20 years as the OJCL Certamen Coach. Certamen is a Jeopardy!-style academic competition with questions about the Latin language and classical civilization. The OH Intermediate certamen team advanced to the Semi-Finals this year.

Latin teacher Lisa Mays is in her 2<sup>nd</sup> year of a 3-year tenure as the OJCL Chair of Students. Lisa serves as a mentor to all the student members of the Executive Board and oversees all the activities of the OJCL.

Here are some of the highlights of the convention:


- Irene Calderon, Jimmy Fraley, and Kendall Richard were members of the OH Intermediate Certamen team which qualified for the Semi-Finals and finished 8th in the nation.
- 2 Summit students were recognized at the General Assembly on Thursday for their performance on the National Latin Exam in March. Ryan Burns and Irene Calderon scored a Perfect Exam, an accomplishment achieved by less than 1% of students. Ryan was also honored for his continued excellence on the NLE, with 4 consecutive Gold Medals.
- Julia Dean won an NJCL Scholarship worth \$4,000. These scholarships are presented to students who have demonstrated excellence in the classroom and dedication to the NJCL.
- Kendall Richard won a Best of Show Award for her bead mosaic of Echo and Narcissus. There were only 5 graphic arts projects selected to earn the coveted Best of Show!
- Out of over 1,000 students, Irene Calderon won 1st Overall in Graphic Arts and 8th in Overall Points. Irene worked extremely hard throughout the year and in the summer to achieve these amazing results!

# 2020 National Mythology Exam

This was the 31st year of the National Mythology Exam. It was taken in February by over 9,000 students from 400 schools in the United States, Canada, and Australia. The goal of the exam is to promote the study of classical mythology and literature in secondary schools. It has 40 (for the 6<sup>th</sup> grade) or 50 (for the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades) or 60 (for 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grades) multiple choice questions. This year's exam had 3 sections:

- the main classical gods & goddesses Zeus, Athena, Mars, etc
- the story of Perseus a son of Zeus who is famous for beheading the snaky-haired Gorgon Medusa
- Book 12 of Homer's <u>Odyssey</u> Odysseus encounters the Sirens, Scylla & Charybdis, and the island of the Sun-god Helios

# 2020 Exploratory Latin Exam

570 students from 27 states competed in the 16<sup>th</sup> annual Exploratory Latin Exam. Its purpose is to promote enthusiasm for the classical world in elementary and middle schools. The ELE is a 50 question multiple choice exam on derivatives, Roman life, mythology, art & architecture, etc. This year's exam included 10 'special topic' questions on 'Ancient Roman Entertainment.'

Questions included:

- > If your teacher said, 'in tabula scribe,' what should you do? (write on the board)
- > Aures audiunt. \_\_\_\_ vident. (oculī)
- Ubi gladiātōrēs pugnant? (in amphitheātrō)

# 2020 Medusa Mythology Exam

The Medusa Mythology Exam is a 40 question multiple-choice test given every November to over 10,000 high school students from across the United States. This exam is much more challenging than the National Mythology Exam and requires a thorough knowledge of Greek mythology.

The theme of this year's competition was 'Family Feuds.' This year's theme focused on the arguments, quarrels, fights, and disputes between and among the Olympian gods and goddesses. Examples include: the Golden Apple of Discord (Aphrodite vs Hera vs Athena), Hephaestus' limp (Hephaestus vs Zeus/Hera), and the abduction of Persephone (Hades vs Demeter).

26% of Summit students earned an award this year.

The National Junior Classical League sponsors 3 online exams: Roman Civilization, Classical Etymology, and Latin Vocabulary. This is the 9th year of these challenging contests.

Over 4,000 students took the online **Classical Etymology Exam**. It was a 50 question, multiple choice exam. Its purpose is to test a student's knowledge of both Latin and Greek derivatives and their usage in the English language. 43% of Summit students earned awards.



Over 139,000 students from all 50 states and 20 foreign countries participated in the 44<sup>th</sup> annual National Latin Exam. The NLE consists of 40 multiple choice questions on grammar, vocabulary, derivatives, mythology, history, and culture. This exam is a chance for students to test their knowledge against Latin students throughout the world. 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade Latin students take this exam.


# Perfect Score on the 2020 NLE – Sophia Nery (Intro Level)
