

2021 Classical Literacy Exam

The Classical Literacy Exam is given to all Latin students in May. This competition measures basic knowledge of all aspects of Greek and Roman civilizations, including vocabulary, expressions, mythology, history, culture, quotes, and geography. The various lists include terms like: quid pro quo (what for what = a trade), spartan (tough and disciplined like soldiers from Sparta), Capri (the island from which the Emperor Tiberius ruled the Roman empire), and the Odyssey (Homer's sequel to the Iliad about the return home of Odysseus from the Trojan War).

2020 NJCL Convention

Five Summit students attended the virtual National Junior Classical League convention on July 24th-29th. Originally scheduled to be at the University of Richmond, all aspects of the convention were converted so that the students could compete from home – even the athletic events! Maddie Mescher '25, Mia Rahner '23, Abby Almaguer '22, Irene Calderon '22, and Jimmy Fraley '22 submitted videos of themselves competing in the Creative Arts, photos of their Graphic Arts projects, took academic tests through Google Forms and competed against other states in Certamen via Zoom.

Mia Rahner won 4th place on the Level 1 Reading Comprehension test and her portfolio of art earned a Magna Cum Laude distinction. Abby Almaguer's portfolio earned a Cum Laude and she served as parliamentarian of the Ohio delegation, leading the state's voting caucus. Jimmy Fraley won 5th place on the Level 3 Geography test, his Modern Myth earned a Summa Cum Laude, and he competed on Ohio's Upper Level Certamen team. Jimmy also served in his capacity as OJCL secretary, taking minutes at all of Ohio's fellowship meetings. The Vox Latina, Summit's Latin Club publication, placed 6th in the nation and was edited by Abby Almaguer and Irene Calderon.

Irene also competed on Ohio's Upper Level Certamen team and placed on two academic tests, earning 5th place on Level 3 Mottoes/Quotations/Abbreviations and 3rd on Level 3 Greek Derivatives. Additionally, Irene's art portfolio earned Magna Cum Laude. Appointed as OJCL's Editor earlier this summer, Irene ran for and was elected to be the 2020-2021 NJCL Editor. As a national officer, Irene will be responsible for creating and editing the national publication of the organization, The Torch. [See attached photo of her remote swearing-in!] She ran a great campaign, highlighting the Middle School and Lower School versions of the Ohio Torch that she created.



Although not present at the virtual convention, Ryan Burns '20 was awarded the Renata Motiu scholarship, endowed in honor of a Latin teacher from Michigan who was part of the NJCL for 33 years. MS/US Latin teacher Lisa Mays continued to serve in her capacity as OJCL State Chair of Students, advising the OJCL board as they led the Ohio delegation through the various activities and competitions.

2021 Ohio Junior Classical League Convention

Over 280 students (and many teachers, adults, and college students) from 22 Ohio schools attended the virtual state competition March 5-7. Summit had a delegation of 22 students to compete.

Summit students won many awards with a consistent effort in all areas of competition: contests and performance arts submitted before convention, graphic arts like models and mosaics, electronic competitions like the Summit newsletter and a commercial, and academic tests like derivatives and mythology.



2021 Pegasus Mythology Exam

The Pegasus Mythology Exam is a multiple-choice test given every February to over 5,000 middle school students from across the United States. This exam includes the origins of the classical gods, the rule of the Olympians, and some stories of transformation.

The 6th graders took a 40 question test and included the following famous stories: Echo and Narcissus (Echo became merely a voice, and Narcissus became a daffodil), the contest for the city Athens (which Athena won with her creation of the olive tree), and Dionysus & the pirates (the god transformed them into dolphins for their failure to recognize his divinity).

53% of Summit 6th graders earned an award this year.



It included the 40 questions from the 6th grade exam with an additional 10 from the opening book of Vergil's Aeneid. Aeneas was a Trojan who escaped the fall of Troy and led the Trojan refugees to a new home in Italy (where his descendants will be Romulus and the Roman people!). The extra questions include: the destiny of Aeneas (new home in Italy), the hatred of Juno (still angry about the Judgment of Paris), and Queen Dido (who founded the city Carthage).

64% of Summit 7th and 8th graders earned an award this year.

2021 Medusa Mythology Exam

The Medusa Mythology Exam is a 40 question multiple-choice test given every February to over 5,000 high school students from across the United States. This exam is challenging and requires a thorough knowledge of Greek mythology.

The theme of this year's competition was 'Monstrous Mutations.' This year's theme focused on famous monsters of mythology, their appearance, and their origins. Examples include: Cerberus (3-headed dog with snakes who guards the entrance to the Underworld), Pegasus (winged horse, born from headless corpse of Medusa, who helped the hero Bellerophon kill the Chimera), and the Spartoi (armed warriors born from serpent's teeth planted by Cadmus).

31% of Summit students earned an award this year.

Over 2,700 students took the online **Classical Etymology Exam**. It was a 50 question, multiple choice exam. Its purpose is to test a student's knowledge of both Latin and Greek derivatives and their usage in the English language. 26% of Summit students earned awards.





2021 Exploratory Latin Exam

About 1000 students competed in the 17th annual Exploratory Latin Exam. Its purpose is to promote enthusiasm for the classical world in elementary and middle schools. The ELE is a 50 question multiple choice exam on derivatives, Roman life, mythology, art & architecture, etc. This year's exam included 10 'special topic' questions on 'Daily Life in Ancient Rome.'
