Simply said, attendance is a privilege, not a right. In extreme cases, if an individuals or group's behavior is deemed to be unacceptable, OfCL reserves the right to require that the offender(s) return bome at their own expense.


Rules and expectations that each Convention Attendee shall observe:

- Curfew for Student Delegates is 12:30 A.M. and may be enforced by ANY Sponsor, Chaperone, or Hotel Staff Member. All Students (except Executive Board Officers) shall be in - and stay in - their respective assigned rooms after that time.
- Delegates are not permitted to change rooms without the prior consent of BOTH their Sponsor and a State Chair.
- Delegates are reminded that ALL Sponsors, SCLers, and Chaperones serve as monitors during the Convention on behalf of OJCL, and each Delegate shall show respect for them and comply with their instructions.
- Behavior that disturbs other guests will not be tolerated. Delegates should remember that they are representing OJCL, their school, and themselves
- Use or possession by any Convention Delegate of alcohol or illegal drugs (including marijuana) is prohibited.
- Any illegal activity, including (but not limited to) gambling, lotteries, betting activities for profit, or other activity in violation of Local, State, or Federal Laws will be reported to the local Authorities and School Officials.
- There shall be no smoking by Student Delegates during Convention. (We ask any Adult who
- chooses to smoke to do so in designated smoking areas or to refrain in general.)

  General Assembly Attendance is mandatory for all Delegates, including commuters, unless otherwise indicated in the Program.
- Only persons attending Convention may participate in contests or Convention activities of
- any kind. Nametags issued at registration shall be worn visibly at all times. You will not be permitted to participate in a TEST or CONTEST or other events without your nametag clearly visible (Creative Contest competitors must have their tags with them and wear them when not being
- Students having access to vehicles at Convention is STRONGLY discouraged. Any student who drives his or her own car to Convention must have written permission from both Sponsor and Parent to drive and/or leave the hotel premises during Convention. Absent such permission, students are prohibited from leaving the hotel during Convention. Students riding in a vehicle driven by a student MUST have written consent of BOTH their Sponsor and Parent to ride in the specific vehicle. Sponsors are highly encouraged to collect car keys.
- Neat school clothes are appropriate attire for everyone. Classical costumes are required for the Roman Banquet. Dressing in hotel sheets is not permitted.
- It is not permitted to put campaign posters/fliers on the walls. Stickers are not allowed. Campaign materials can be handed out to delegates. OJCL reserves the right to review any and all campaign material prior to its being displayed. Inappropriate or slanderous materials will not be permitted.
- Any missing or damaged articles/property will be charged to your chapter and ultimately to ou. Any additional charges to your room will be charged to your school.
- During testing sessions, you may not sit adjacent to individuals with the same color nametag as your own. You SHALL NOT request assistance from a Sponsor/Chaperone from your Club. Use of any outside sources, including smart watches and opening additional tabs/windows, during any competition is prohibited. Officers and those assisting the OJCL Officers are not responsible for individual attendee's
- actions and are not responsible for damages related to those actions by individual attendees.
- Students must not misuse the elevators with overcrowding, continuous riding, horseplay, etc.





#### Digging Up Homer

Presented by Graham Braun & Jacob Engstrom, University of Cincinnati

Did the Trojan War really happen? This presentation is designed to give the audience an introduction to the archaeological evidence for one of the most gripping stories of the ancient world, Homer's Iliad. Discussion focuses on archaeological excavations at Bronze Age palaces in Greece including those of Agamemnon and Nestor at Mycenae and Pylos, and from the citadel at Troy. Different forms of archaeological evidence including ceramics, fortifications, weapons, wall paintings, bones, and bathtubs paint a varied and dynamic picture of an ancient way of life. But is this enough to prove Homer's tale? To answer this tantalizing question, this presentation looks at the

problems involved when Homer and archaeology are brought together and what archaeologists are doing to figure out the best ways to determine if "X" truly marks the spot.

#### Massacre In The Woodlands: A 2000 Year Old Roman Cold Case

#### Presented by Alessandro Battaglia, University of Cincinnati

In the Summer of 9 AD, three Roman legions marching into the German woodlands were ambushed by German warriors and slaughtered almost to a man. The Romans lost up to 20,000 men in one of their most dramatic defeats, stopping any further Roman expansion into Germany. For centuries archaeologists and historians looked for the battle site identified with the battle of Teutoburg, looking into the Roman historians' accounts to find a suitable location. Finally, the combined efforts of archaeologists and historians yielded a possible site in the late 80's: the hill of Kalkriese. Together, we will investigate the battlefield at Kalkriese and the history of its discovery. Together, we will decide whether this archaeological site in the woodlands of Northern Germany fits the profile of the battle of Teutoburg. In our in-depth investigation, we will examine the weapons, tools, and everyday objects of both Romans and Germans, and see what the battlefield at Kalkriese can tell us about the battle that took place there 2000 years ago.
